Dear brothers and sisters,

As I write this my ordination to be priested is just over a month and a half away.

This year has flown by and it only seems like yesterday when I arrived at St. Marys and the Gt. Baddow team to start my curacy and year as Deacon. Fresh faced from college and the academic bubble of Cambridge, it's fair to say it took our family and I a while to adjust to life in the parish. I especially found the challenge of moving into a



larger church than I had been in at college daunting but also the moving into public ministry has required some processing and adjustment, especially in reflecting on the role and function of a minister.

Being a deacon is about serving and is rightly the foundation for all ministry. Amongst the discernment and ordination process I had read the recommended reading and understanding of the threefold ministry of Deacons, Priests and Bishops. I also appreciated reading Bishop Graham Tomlin's 'The Widening circle' book and his input at last year's Bradwell Study day which developed my understanding of the calling of creation to glorify God, God's people, the church to witness God's love and intercede for the world and the individual priestly calling to equip the Church for good works. As I prepare to be priested, amongst the ordinal promise I especially take seriously the call to preach God's word and care for God's people.

You may ask what have been the highlights of my last year? The annual Holiday club was fantastic and although I very much felt fresh faced and underprepared, it gave me a real sense of the desire for mission which is the beating heart of St. Marys. I have also enjoyed serving the community in Foodbank and helping lead our new home group. I very much look forward to further opportunities to learn further especially in the wider team churches.

Today I was reminded today of the passage from John 15 where Jesus declares He is the true vine and especially his analogy of pruning and cutting back in order to produce fruit. This act of pruning reminds me of times along my journey in responding to God's call. At times I have felt like being in a process of being pruned but also formed and shaped for God's service.

I would like to thank you all for your kind support, patience and encouragement during this year, especially with welcoming us as a family. I would love to see as many as possible at the occasion of my ordination whether at the service or following at the church tea. I understand not all can and will be able to attend and I appreciate your prayers.

Mission Focus on FEBA

Two-Wav Communication

At first glance radio appears a one-way communication device – 'it' speaks: listener listen.



We can think back to images of families gathered around the radio before TV, particularly during war times, listening to news, public announcements, and Prime Ministers' and Sovereigns' addresses to the nation.

But times have changed and so has radio. It is now a two-way medium where listeners also get to speak. They make music requests, share their opinions, contribute to phone-ins or have their responses read out on air. And two-way communication is really needed to develop relationships of trust.

We see this clearly in the Bible too. In the Old Testament, the prophets spoke the words of God to the people, and the priests spoke the people's words to God. In the New Testament, Jesus became God's Word to the people, and because of his death his followers could speak directly to God becoming their own priesthood.

Feba's partners work to develop two-way communication with their listeners. They want to engage with their audience, to know of their joys and hopes, their dreams as well as their challenges and issues they face. Their programmes speak news, advice and information to them but radio has also enabled listeners to speak and be heard. As they share their experiences and opinions they speak to each other, to community leaders and officials. Using the medium of radio, they can 'find' each other and work together for a changed community.

Thank you for praying for Feba. As you speak to God, you can have his confidence that you are being heard. "If we ask anything according to his will, he hears us." (1 John 5: 14b)




